Abstract Animals

This animal doesn't have an ink sac unlike many of its kind as it rarely encounters predators in the deep sea. To move, it uses its ear-like fins to propel through the water and steers using its webbed arms. The largest grown of this species was 5 feet and 10 inches (1.9m) long and weighed 13 pounds

(5.9 kg). However, they tend to be around 7.9 to 12 inches (20-30cm) long.


Land Animal article...

Amur Leopard

The Amur Leopard lives in Asia and Africa and is one of the most endangered land animals in the world. *Panthera pardus*.

People usually think of leopards in the savannas of Africa but in the Russian Far East, a rare subspecies has adapted to life in the forests that make up the northern-most part of the species' range. Similar to other leopards, the Amur leopard can run at speeds of up to 37 miles per hour. This incredible animal has been reported to leap more than 19 feet horizontally and up to 10 feet vertically.

The Amur leopard is solitary (it lives alone). Nimble-footed and strong, it carries and hides unfinished kills so that they are not taken by other predators. They live for 10-15 years, and in captivity up to 20 years. The Amur leopard is also known as the Far East leopard, the Manchurian leopard or the Korean leopard.



Air pollution

hat is air pollution?

Air pollution is when unwanted chemicals, gasses, and particles enter the air and the <u>atmosphere</u> causing harm to animals and damaging the natural cycles of the Earth.

Natural Causes of Air Pollution

Some sources of air pollution come from nature. These include eruptions of volcanoes, dust storms, and <u>forest fires</u>.

Human Causes of Air Pollution

Human activity is a major cause of air pollution, especially in large cities. Human air pollution is caused by things such as factories, power plants, cars, airplanes, chemicals, fumes from spray cans, and methane gas from landfills.

Effects on the Environment

Air pollution and the release of gasses into the atmosphere can have many negative effects on the environment.

- <u>Global warming</u> One type of air pollution is the addition of <u>carbon</u> dioxide gas into the air. Some scientists believe that releasing too much carbon dioxide into the atmosphere is one of the causes of global warming. This upsets the balance of the <u>carbon cycle</u>.
- The ozone layer The ozone layer helps protect us from harmful rays from the sun. It is getting damaged from air pollution such as methane gas from livestock and CFCs from spray cans.
- Acid Rain Acid rain is created when gasses such as sulfur dioxide get high into the
 atmosphere. The wind can blow these gasses for miles and then they get washed out of the air
 when it rains. This rain is called acid rain and can damage forests and kill fish.

What can you do to help?

Anytime you can use less energy, like electricity, it can help reduce air pollution. You can help by turning off the lights when leaving your room and not leaving the TV or computer on when you're not using it. Driving less helps a lot too. Be sure to talk to your parents about sharing car journeys with friends and planning errands so that you can get them all done in a single trip. This saves money on fuel as well, which everyone likes!





There are many different types of bug hotels that can be suitable for gardens big or small. These bug hotels increase the chance of insects visiting your garden.

The biggest sort of pollution are land based sources such as oil industry, motor vehicles and farms. This is known as 'run-off' and 80% of ocean pollution starts on land.

Thousands of tons of waste is dumped into the ocean on a daily basis.

300,000 dolphins and porpoises die each each as a result of getting tangled in old fishing nets.



Word of the Week

POLLUTION

Pollution means damage to the environment caused by human activities such as: Chemicals used in farming kills insects.

- 1. 5000 people die every day and 1 million seabirds die from pollution.
- 2. 3.7 million tons of carbon dioxide emissions by 2030.
- 3. More than half *a billion* plastic *straws* are used *every* day around the world.
- 4. Over half of the world's plastic thrown *out* in 2015 was plastic *packaging*.
- 5. *Takeout* orders account for around 269,000 US tons of plastic waste.
- 6. *16 billion* disposable *coffee cups* are used *each year*.
